

National Sun Yat-Sen University Academic Activity Subsidy Guidelines

Approved by 1st Administrative Affairs Committee Meeting on 31 October, 2003
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- Article 1 These guidelines are established in order to encourage teachers and students of the university to actively participate in international academic activities, promote academic exchanges, and improve academic standards.
- Article 2 The source of funding for the school's academic activities subsidies is the University Endowment Fund.
- Article 3 Subsidy Items and Objectives:
- (1) Subsidy for publication of papers: Full-time staff, full-time students and retired teachers of the university are required to publish academic papers with the name of the university, for which no subsidies have been issued or applied for from other organizations, without proper reason.
 - (2) Travel subsidy for hosting or participating in important international academic conferences: Full-time staff and full-time students of the university are invited to host or publish academic papers at international academic conferences, for which no subsidies have been issued or applied for from other organizations, without proper reason. The definition of an international academic conference shall be based on the definition of the Ministry of Science and Technology.
 - (3) Subsidies for hosting academic conferences (academic conferences refer to workshops, symposiums, conferences, or seminars):
Academic conferences are divided into three categories:
Category 1: Organizing or commissioning important international academic conferences and seminars.
Category 2: To hold or commission annual academic conferences related to disciplines recognized by the Ministry of Science and Technology.
Category 3: Organizing or commissioning important academic seminars that have been reviewed and approved.
 - (4) Subsidy for academic exchanges: In order to strengthen and encourage academic exchanges between the university and domestic and foreign academic institutions, each institution may sign cooperation and exchange agreements with foreign universities and conduct various exchange activities.
 - (5) Hold academic achievement presentations: University teacher presentations of individual academic achievements (such as concerts, recitals, etc.) or group art performance presentations.
 - (6) Organizing academic competitions: National or academic competitions sponsored by the university.
- Article 4 In order to review the academic activities subsidy of the university, the Academic Activities Subsidy Review Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Review Committee) is specially established, the Senior Vice President shall recruit relevant committee members.

Article 5 The review regulations shall be formulated by the review committee.

Article 6 The business undertaking unit is the Office of Research and Development, which is responsible for handling regular affairs.

Article 7 These guidelines, and any subsequent revisions, shall be approved and implemented by the Executive Council.
