

National Sun Yat-Sen University Teaching and Research Staff Top International Academic Performance Grants Guidelines

1. National Sun Yat-Sen University has formulated these guidelines to recognize and encourage the outstanding research performance of its teachers, and to encourage departments and institutes to provide a more complete teaching and research environment to support teachers' research.
2. The recipients of the grant
Current full-time teachers, researchers, post-doctoral researchers and their departments (institutions) and colleges.
3. Scope of Award
 - (1) Teachers who have published papers in Nature or Science (excluding other journals established by Nature Publishing Group and American Association for the Advancement of Science) and their departments
 1. The paper types are Original article or Review article.
 2. When the paper is published, the author must use the name of the university (National Sun Yat-sen University) as the affiliating unit of the first author.
 3. Each paper is limited to one recipient. When the paper is co-authored by two or more teachers from the university, the first author or the author of highest ranking will receive the award and coordinate the distribution of the award amount.
 - (2) Highly Cited Researcher and its affiliated department (institution) in the given year.
4. Amount of award and subsidy
Publishing papers in Nature or Science (excluding other journals established by Nature Publishing Group and American Association for the Advancement of Science).
 - (1) :
 1. The first or corresponding author will be awarded NT\$500,000 for each article, and a NT\$500,000 subsidy for teaching and research for the department (institution), and NT\$100,000 for teaching and research fees for their colleges.
 2. The non-first or corresponding author will be awarded NT\$200,000 per paper, and a NT\$200,000 subsidy for teaching and research for the department (institution), and NT\$50,000 for teaching and research fees for their colleges.
 3. Each paper is limited to one award, and multiple applications for the same type of award from the university are not accepted.
 - (2) Highly Cited Researcher
Each recipient in the given year will be awarded NT\$200,000, and a NT\$100,000 subsidy for teaching and research for the department (institution).
5. Operating procedures
Applicants will submit relevant online search records and copies of the published paper to the Office of Research and Development for approval; or the Office of Research and Development will actively collect relevant information to submit to the president for

approval.

6. The main source of funding for this award is the University Endowment Fund.
7. These guidelines, and any subsequent revisions, shall be approved by the Executive Council and the University Endowment Funds Management Committee, and shall be implemented upon approval by the university president.
